# What Makes a Christian?

What is it that makes (produces) a Christian?

Wearing a cross? I have seen many celebrities who live blatantly immoral and godless lives wearing a cross. Maybe it's a good luck charm to them rather

than a statement of faith and commitment but it certainly doesn't make them Christian.

Living a moral life? Living a moral life is certainly commendable but as we know from Scripture a moral life without faith is pointless and does not impress God. "Without faith it is impossible to please God." (Hebrews 11:6)

Having your name on a church membership roster? I have been amazed over the years how common this idea is among many so-called Christians. The Pharisees were moral, "religious" and knew their Scriptures, but because they lacked faith and trust in Jesus he called them "Sons of the Devil."

The latest issue of *The Lutheran Witness* included a quote from Luther

about "what makes a Christian." Luther wrote, "What makes (produces/builds) a Christian is: 1)Prayer, 2)God's Word, 3)Trials. Obviously he was not saying that these are the only signs of a Christian. Being a Christian includes the sacraments, daily and weekly worship, fellowship with fellow believers and using your spiritual gifts to serve others. Also by "trials" he isn't talking about illnesses, physical problems, etc. Trials refers to things that we suffer because we are Christian. Things like persecution, sacrifice, and loss which is a result of living out our faith.



All of the great people of the Bible were "tested" in their faith by trials. Abraham was told to sacrifice his only son and by trusting God he was willing to do it. Joseph was sold into slavery by his own

brothers, falsely accused and thrown into prison for over a decade, and still put his trust in God. Saint Paul suffered greatly as a missionary but never gave up. Stephen was stoned to death for his faith. Eleven of the 12 disciples were martyred. Hebrews 11 gives us a "Hall of Faith" to remind us of what our Christian ancestors suffered while remaining faithful.

Pastor Richard Wurmbrand was imprisoned by Communists for 14 years because of his faith. He often took his Confirmation class to the zoo on their Confirmation day. He stood them in front of the lions' cage and told them that their commitment could one day cost them their life as it had the early Christians. In our Confirmation vow we say, "I will be faithful to Jesus even if it costs me my life." Is that still true? Or were we just saying words without thinking?

If there is one thing that is constant in the life of every child of God, it is: 1)Prayer,

2)Trust in God's Word, 3)Trials brought on by our faith.

It is through our faith in Jesus Christ, using the tools with which he has gifted us, that God forms and leads us in our Christian walk and "makes us Christian." St. Peter wrote, "Dear friends, do not be surprised at the fiery ordeal that has come on you to test you, as though something strange were happening to you." It is part of God's process.
