What is Grey Christianity?

Recently I heard a term I was totally unfamiliar with: "Grey Christianity." The idea is that God (and therefore the Bible) is not "black and white" but in-between on most issues, thus grey. Today "tolerance" has become elevated

and become the chief virtue above all others. In fact, our "enlightened" culture is now convinced that the only thing that shouldn't be tolerated is intolerance!

For many, it is easy to fall into this "grey" trap when discussing Christianity. For example, when a topic such as homosexuality, gender identity (whatever that is) or the exclusivity of salvation through Christ is brought up, many want to "round out the corners" a little.

Grey Christians want a "softer" God because they want to make the truths presented in God's Word a little less offensive. They feel Biblical teachings are just too offensive for an "enlightened" society such as ours.

The God of the Bible is patient, kind, loving, and forgiving, but He is not tolerant of sin or

unbelief. There are no teachings in Scripture that show the Lord declared certain sins as "semi-okay," or that false teaching is no longer false. He may exercise patience, He may give extended calls to repentance, but never does He

change His mind on what is sin and what is righteousness. He never wavers on salvation through anyone or anything other than Jesus Christ.

Grey Christianity deceives people into an even stronger belief in a god they have imagined for themselves, a god who is tolerant of their favorite sins and a casual attitude toward all things holy.

Elijah, John the Baptist, Moses and Jesus were not grey. We should be cordial, friendly, generous and accepting as we deal with other people but we don't have to give up our foundational beliefs

just to appease anyone. Ultimately we are answerable not to people's opinions of us or our beliefs. We are answerable only to God.
